Distinguished Director, and faculty of IIM-Calcutta, guests and my young friends, I am very happy to be with you this afternoon. Indian institute of Management-Calcutta, is one of the earliest management colleges of higher learning to be set up in the country . The pioneering spirit continues even after IIM Calcutta has transformed itself into a world class institution. Graduation is not the end but the beginning of learning and change. I have found that people who succeed most in their careers are those who can constantly transform themselves. First, you have got to have a dream. Dreams are very powerful internal motivators. People will respect you for your honesty, if not your wisdom. Fourth, think about what you will take on next rather than about what you may be letting go. Fifth, contribute in every situation. Sixth, pursue excellence in whatever you do. Seventh, while you must take your career seriously, do not take yourself too seriously. You have to laugh and find humour everyday. This will help you to keep issues in their perspective. Eighth, we must always know what we are really good at. Ninth, always welcome feedback, even if it comes in the guise of criticism. Finally, always play to win. Winning is not about making the other person lose. It is about stretching yourself to your own limits. It is instructive to look at how creative ideas are generated. Some do seem to arrive as a bolt from the blue, whereas others are quite obviously the result of a considerable amount of painstaking work. Even the bolts from the blue do not arrive fully formed in your head with no effort. Have you ever noticed how you push really hard for a breakthrough in a particular area and have no success, until someone after you had given up? The fact is you never stopped working on the issue. You may have consciously moved on to other things, but the final idea came about as a result of the work that your subconscious was doing in the background. It is often a useful technique to research a particular area and then leave it for a week before going further. This will allow your subconscious the opportunity to structure your thoughts and to work on interesting, unusual approaches. If your objective is to generate creative ideas, there are a number of approaches open to you. The first is to sit and think. The second approach is to cram into your head all of the data that you might need to address the problem and then leave it alone. You are likely to have further thoughts as a result of the work your subconscious does. This approach is pretty hit and miss for most of us. The third approach is the structured one. That is to work with a technique or range of techniques aimed at improving your ability to generate ideas. This is often the most effective approach as you work more and more at generating ideas and creative solutions to problems, you will find that you become more effective even without resorting to formal techniques. Eventually, like the master carpenter who no longer has to think of his interaction with the wood he shapes, you will not need to think of removing obstacles; the techniques will become internalised and a part of the way you think.
