You usually want to keep the subject to just a few words describing the content of the body of the e-mail message. You may also see options for attachments and forwards. You can add files to your e-mails by using the attachment option. There are two things about file attachments you need to be careful of. There is a need to be careful with the attachments as they are one of the most common ways for computer viruses to spread. Some viruses can destroy all the data on your computer.
